

Hallie Dreyer currently serves as a Laboratory Supervisor in the DNA Unit at the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation. In that capacity, she is responsible for the direct supervision of forensic scientists, performing administrative reviews of casework, managing the day-to-day operations of the local laboratory, and ensuring unit compliance with all policies, procedures, and accreditation requirements. Additionally, she currently serves as the laboratory representative for the multidisciplinary Cold Case unit for the bureau.

Hallie has a bachelor's degree in biology from John Carroll University and a master's degree in forensic science from Virginia Commonwealth University. She has been working in the field of forensic DNA analysis since 2010 starting as a forensic scientist and working her way up into a lab management role. As a scientist, she has performed DNA analysis on thousands of cases and testified several hundred times as an expert in courts across Ohio. She routinely provides training to law enforcement personnel on topics specific to forensic DNA analysis and laboratory practices.

Hallie has worked closely with the Cold Case Unit since its inception as both a forensic scientist and lab supervisor. She regularly reviews and consults on cold case evidence in accordance with best lab practices to facilitate evidence processing for these cases.
