

Roger Davis serves as the Special Agent in Charge for the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI). In this role, he leads statewide investigative operations across several divisions, including Major Crimes (homicides and officer-involved critical incidents), Special Investigations (sexual assaults and crimes against children), and Narcotics Investigations. He also oversees BCI's multidisciplinary Cold Case Unit, coordinating efforts among investigative personnel, forensic laboratory experts, and criminal intelligence analysts.

Roger's responsibilities include the management and oversight of high-profile and complex criminal investigations, such as officer-involved shootings, homicides, serial offenders, public corruption cases, child physical and sexual assault investigations, and cyber-enabled crimes involving online child exploitation. Over the course of his 31-year career in law enforcement, he has held a wide range of positions at both state and local levels, including patrol officer, assistant field commander for a narcotics task force, criminal investigator, special agent, and multiple supervisory roles.

Roger holds a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of Cincinnati and a master's degree in criminal justice from the University of Massachusetts–Lowell. He is a graduate of the FBI National Leadership Academy and is a nationally recognized presenter and collaborator in the areas of death investigations and cold case methodology and continues to serve as an instructor for ongoing FBI National Academy classes on these subjects.
